<b>Several</b>	:	more than two, but not a huge amount.
<b>Stream</b>	:	A small river or flowing body of water.
<b>Angrily</b>	:	In an angry way.
<b>Naughty</b>	:	Behaving badly in a playful way.
<b>Overturning</b>	:	Turning something upside down.
<b>Stop</b>	:	To make someone or something cease to move or act.
<b>Enough</b>	:	As much as is necessary or required.
<b>Fold</b>	:	To bend or crease something so that one part covers another.
<b>Delightful</b>	:	Very pleasant.
<b>Gently</b>	:	In a careful and kind way.

In the second sentence, 'he' is used instead of the word 'boy'.

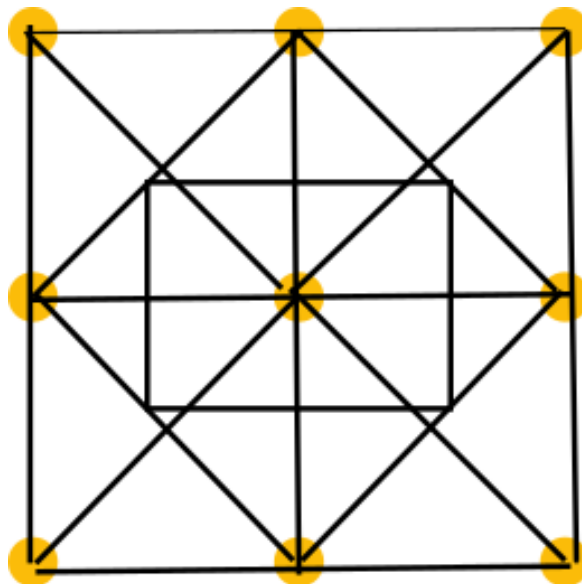
