# Ch 3. This is My Town

The poem "This is My Town" describes a town in a simple and structured way. It starts by introducing the town and then moves step by step into smaller spaces within it. The town has streets, which contain houses. Inside the houses, there are rooms, and within a room, there is a bed. On the bed, there is a basket, and inside the basket, there are flowers. The poem then reverses the order, tracing the elements back from the flowers to the town.

This poem helps young learners understand the concept of location and how different places are connected. It uses repetition and a rhythmic pattern to make learning fun and easy.

#### New words

Train – A long vehicle that moves on tracks.

Town – A place where people live and work, larger than a village.

Street - A road in a town or city with houses and buildings on both sides.

House - A building where people live.

Flower - A colorful part of a plant that blooms and smells nice.

Basket – A woven materials container used to carry or hold things.




